SUMMARY OF LEVITTOWN COMPLAINT PROGRESS

- Mar. 3, '58 Letter of Dr. Milligan to Mr. Levitt requesting conference.
- Mar. 3-31, '58 Exchange of letters between Milligan and Levitt; conference not obtained.
- Mar. 31, '58 Special Investigation #14-23 initiated.
- Apr. 4 to May 2, '58 Dept. of State, Div. of Water Supply, Dept. of Health, Willingboro Twp. officials, County officials and FHA and VA officials contacted in investigation.
- May 8, '58 FR Glatt conference with Goldman "no policy statement yet."
- June 6, '58 Nation-wide release of Levitt statement of policy; "policy unchanged as to sales to Negroes."
- June 6, '58 Conference of BAD officials with Levitt-Goldman.
- June 7, '58 Opening of Levittown sales campaign.
- June 16, '58 F. Todd complaint received and registered that he was denied purchase rights on June 8, '58.
- June 20, '58 W. James complaint received and registered that he was denied purchase rights on June 9, '58.
- June 20, '58 Check with FHA determined that commitment met as yet made.
- June 24, '58 Apprized of FHA commitment made to Levitt, June 23, 1958.
- July 1, '58 BAD officials in conciliation conference with Levitt-Goldman.
- July 2, '58 New complaint from F. Todd received and registered alleging that again on June 28 he had been denied purchase rights at Levittown.
- July 10, '58 New complaint from W. James received and registered alleging that again on June 29 he had been denied purchase rights at Levittown.
- July 24, '58 Deputy Attorney General Cook and FR Glatt in conciliation conference with Goldman (negotiations in Cook's hands during vacation season).
- Sept. 9, '58 Deputy Attorney General Cook and FR Glatt in conciliation conference with Goldman.

- Oct. 8, '58 Lett and Jones met in conciliation conference with
Goldman; conciliation declared fruitless.
- Oct. 21, '58 Notice of Public Hearing mailed to principals.
- Nov. 19, '58 Request for delay of hearing brought notice this date
of postponement until December 15.
- Dec. 12, '58 Phone notice received that Levitt has petitioned
Superior Court for stay of proceedings.
